Sunday, October 31<sup>st</sup>. will be the eve of All Saints Day; All Saints Day always falls on November 1<sup>st</sup>. We will celebrate All Saints Day on the next Sunday, November 7<sup>th</sup>. October 31<sup>st</sup> in our culture we celebrate Halloween. Historically, in the church calendar this day was known as "All Hallows Eve." The word "hallowed" in Old English meant holy or sanctified; hence, All Saints Day was All Hallow's Day. It's easy to see how All Hallow's Eve got contracted into Hallowe'en.

Our *Book of Occasional Services* offers us an office for All Hallow's Eve. So, on Halloween evening, we will gather at the cemetery at New Friendship Primitive Baptist Church to celebrate the office of All Hallow's Eve. You might want to bring a flashlight or candles. The traditions of All Saints Day and All Souls' Day (Nov 2) include visiting cemeteries and praying for those who have died.
