The five Lenten Holy Conversations represent my effort to perform those three tasks. We shift the context by gathering people around tables over a light meal. We are posing questions for you to answer and discuss each week. And, the leader (moi) does not offer answers—rather I (and all of us) are listening deeply. We are being surprised and delighted (in very positive ways) about what the Spirit brings to the surface.

What we learn will set our agenda as a parish for my time with you and for the near term of the new rector's tenure. The results also will inform the search committee as they write the parish profile. I have not come to you with answers. Rather, I have come to you with a process for discussion, listening, and harvesting the results into concrete actions.

These conversations will be the most crucial activity of my time among you. Your attendance and support are essential any shared vision emerging ins our community and to a renewed engagement with God's mission in our area.
