





Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour."

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.



<u>Stewardship Update</u> – We have received 69 pledges as of Tuesday, November 15th for a total of \$356,010 — 3 new pledges totaling \$10,800 2 have previously given but not pledged totaling \$5,800.

22 pledges stayed the same totaling \$104,020

35 increased their pledge totaling \$217,610 with an increase of \$27,810 7 decreased their pledge totaling \$17,780 with a decrease of \$13,260 (making our overall pledge increase total \$14,550)

That gives the finance committee support and insight as they anticipate our 2023 budget.
