I joined Christ Church in the fall of 1983 and was immediately drafted into the old 11:30 am Folk group by my sister: she was the group leader. The next summer, when she was serving at her post as Camp Director at Honey Creek, I was the leader of the group. The only guitarist we had did not show one Sunday and I was forced to lead the service acapella.

Merrill Guice The Good Lord used that trial by fire to lead me to learn how to play guitar and I soon developed into a worship leader. I led the 11:30 service the next summer on the guitar. Thank you, Jesus! I have led many a service since then along with Worship leader at Cursillo, Vocare, Happening and Parish weekends.

I have served as a Licensed Lay Reader and Chalice Administrator, leader of the College ministry, Happening/EYC leader and occasionally in the main (traditional) Choir. I have served on Vestry and as Christ Church member of the Diocesan Council. I have served on the annual pledge drive on several occasions. I designed the "We Love Christ Church" logo that we still use today.

I have also filled many other roles when asked by our rector. I am currently one of the volunteer office workers in the church office. Why do I want to be on Vestry? I was asked to run by John Hiers. When John calls on you to do something at the church, the only answer is yes. One valuable lesson I have learned is that a Vestry should be patient and wait on the Holy Spirit to show the way. Every time a Vestry passes something by a close majority vote it has failed. Vestry has to do a harder thing; decide by consensus.

I could remember us having a very violent discussion about whether to put a 10 year or a 20 year roof on the old assistant priest house. The very narrow vote resulted in a win for the 20 year roof. The roof lasted three years before a subsequent vestry voted to tear the building down and put in the current parking lot behind the church office. That is just one example. I know too many more.

What will I do? I could see myself working on the pledge drive committee or college ministry or any number of things. When there is a call: I will answer.

I was baptized in the Episcopal church as a child, further nurtured in my faith by attending St Philips Cathedral in Atlanta and for many years have found a loving home attending Christ Episcopal Church in Valdosta. Over several years I have wanted to give my talents to Christ Church however I have often wondered what talents to offer. I have a gift for outreach, creativity, and a gift for business.

Many years back I took on the project of restoring the

Church (circa 1915) in Early County; this is a church in our diocese bordering Alabama. It took one year to

I installed a new roof on the sanctuary, new HVAC, with Hazmat suits & OSHA tents we removed all lead-based paint, repaired the 100 plus year-old front doors (transported them to Valdosta for restoration under the guidance of the Thomasville Historical Society) and restored the parapets to their original state. I saw this project to its successful completion which provided the Blakely parish a viable facility should they grow the church.

The reason for the above story is to say that I understand commitment, long hours, working with different personalities, and getting things accomplished. That is a gift which I can offer Christ Church.

If given the opportunity I would love to serve, work with you, and nurture the growth of Christ Episcopal Church.
