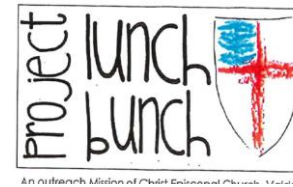


DAUGHTERS OF THE KING MONDAY, OCTOBER 13
